ASMI ORGANISED MARITIME LECTURE AND NETWORKONE RECEPTION FOR STUDENTS

ASMI, together with MaritimeONE Partners, Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore, Singapore Maritime Foundation (SMF), Singapore Shipping Association organised the 5th MaritimeONE Maritime Leaders Speaker Series (MLSS) cum NetworkONE Reception. Held on 22 June at Amara Hotel, the event was a collaboration under the MaritimeONE initiative to create greater awareness of maritime industry among our younger generation.

Mr Michael Chia, Chairman, SMF kicked off the session with a welcome address. He informed the students that, "The Singapore maritime sector is one of the key pillars of the Singapore economy... There are 5,000 maritime companies in Singapore and over 170,000 people in the maritime workforce."

Three speakers from the industry shared their wealth of knowledge and maritime experience. The first speaker was Capt Rod Short, Executive Secretary of Association of Maritime Education and Training Institution in Asia Pacific. Capt Short, a veteran seafarer, shared his vast and enriching experience in the maritime industry.

Mr Chia Yujin, Assistant Marketing Manager at Pacific Radiance Ltd enlightened the students with his insights on "Maritime Careers Opportunities for Young Maritime

Professionals". He recounted his career paths and the diverse areas he had served in.

Third speaker, Mr Kenneth Tan spoke on "The Dynamism of the Maritime Industry". Mr Tan who is the Bunker Operations Manager from American President Lines shared his observations and experiences in the various areas of specialisation in his career in the shipping industry. The session was wrapped up with a question-and-answer session chaired by Mr David Chin, Executive Director, SMF.

A NetworkONE Reception was also held to provide opportunity for students to meet maritime employers and interact with maritime professionals at the event. 40 representatives from 20 maritime companies were present to engage the students and answer queries on the

types of careers and opportunities in their companies.

The event was attended by 160 tertiary students from various disciplines. They came from Nanyang Technological University, National University of Singapore, Singapore Management University, Newcastle University, Ngee Ann Polytechnic and Singapore Polytechnic.

OCCUPATIONAL FIRST-AID COURSE

The Workplace Safety and Health (WSH) Act will be extended to cover all Workplaces by 1 September 2011. Clause 5 (1) of the WSH (First-Aid) Regulations requires workplaces which employ more than 25 persons to appoint first-aiders who are readily available during office hours. Clause 5 (2) of the same Regulation requires the person appointed as first-aider to attend and successfully complete approved training or re-training in first-aid treatment.

To help companies meet this requirement, ASMI is launching a 27-hour **Occupational First-Aid Course**. The course will be conducted at the Marine Industry Training Centre (MITC) operated by ASMI and located at 30 Tuas Ave 10.

The course will cover the basic principles and practice of first aid, knowledge on wounds, burns, shock, fractures and other common workplace injuries. The course is practical oriented and includes basic first aid skills, CPR with an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and the management of medical emergencies. There will be an end of course written and practical examination. A Training Pass will be issued to participants who have successfully completed the course and pass the course examination.

The course fee is \$320.00 nett per participant. SDF Funding is available for Singaporeans or Permanent Residents. The course fee after SDF subsidy is \$152.00 nett per participant. For more information, please contact ASMI at Tel: 6863 3038 or via email: admin@asmi.com.
